

# 8 Questions JOB SEEKERS SHOULD NEVER ASK EMPLOYERS

## “Can I do this job from home?”

Asking your potential employer to take your job home signifies disinterest and unwillingness to work under supervision.

## “What does this company do?”

One of the golden rules of job interview is to prepare and research the company beforehand, so you will not end up asking your prospective hiring manager what the organization does.

## “What is the salary for this position?”

You must be curious, but asking this question in a first interview is a no-no. If you don't like a job that pays less than your expected salary, then state it in your cover letter.

## “When can I take time off for a vacation?”

There's no assurance that you got the job, yet you already want to know when you can take time off for a vacation? Smells like you're only for leave benefits.

## “How many hours will I be expected to work? Do I have to work during weekends?”

Don't ask your prospective employer about extra working hours. He may think you're hoping to work as little as possible.

## “What type of health insurance does this organization offer?”

The only time you're allowed to ask this question is when you passed the interview and got the position. Besides, are you more concerned about the benefits than the job itself?

## “How long will I have to wait until I get a promotion?”

This is one of the worst questions to ask hiring managers. It implies that you're impatient and only in it for something better.

## “Did I get the job?”

Lastly, this question will leave your future hiring managers an impression that you're desperate for the job. You can instead ask, “Do you do multiple rounds of interviews with job candidates?”
